My antenna project started when reading the AARL Antenna book 25th addition, the "Halo" antenna. I always wanted to try building a loop antenna and after looking at my scrap materials, I found everything I needed. The antenna uses 3/8" hard aluminum tubing that I had to anneal (soften) with a blowtorch first before bending into a circle. I ordered a tube bender and watched online on how to slowly bend the aluminum tube into a perfect 3-foot diameter half circle. The mast and boom material is electrical PVC tubing, to avoid metallic interference.



It is tuned with a gamma match using tubing that I had to cut precisely and adjust using my Nano-VNA. It is tuned close to the 6 Meter calling frequency of 50.125 MHZ and has fine SWR readings up to 51 MHZ, making it very narrow banded but good for the USB phone portion of the 6-Meter Band. However, the dimensions in the 25th AARL Antenna book article were different from the QST article it referenced in the 1975 QST article, so the Antenna was tuning to 147 MHZ, which was way out of band.

So, I had to re-cut the circular tubing to the 1975 article dimensions and now it tunes just fine! (Always check the dimension numbers as noted in these articles.)

This antenna was built in my metal shop that has seen many years of successful construction of antennas, and many other metal projects. Now I am just waiting for the *Magic Band* to come alive for some enjoyable DX.

There are also two 6 Meter USB Nets locally that I join and am getting good signal reports from this antenna!


stopped by Randy's KB3IFH booth to wave a hand and catch up on each other's goings on.
